
How to Use your Booklet Bleed Guide – General Use

- 1. Download your guide from our website- these are PNG! Double check to make sure you are maintaining the right format when you save it to your "Pictures" Folder.
 - If you are setting up your booklet to be side by side, please download our "Booklet Overlay (PNG) 11 x 17 Set up" which is set up for an 11x17 booklet.
 - If you are setting up your booklet one page at a time, please download our "Booklet Overlay (PNG) 8.5 x 11 Set up" which is set up for an 8.5x11 page.
- 2. Once the format you've chosen has been downloaded, move into your design program and create your new project. If using a template, please make sure you click on Custom. If using a word processor, look under "layout" and one of those options should be to customize your Page Size. What you want to end up with is a base page size of: 11.25×8.63 or 11.25×17.25 . Remember your longest size determines if your book will be landscape (\leftrightarrow) or portrait (\updownarrow).
- 3. Now that your page is all set up, design away! When finished, you can overlay the PNG Guide by using insert/upload/import (most programs work with verbiage along those lines). Center your PNG picture over your page, and work to move your borders/images/text within the guidelines. Delete the overlay, save/export/publish and voila! A fool proof booklet layout sure to save you time and money with the printer \odot
